SUBJECT: Rock Island Arsenal Ammunition Amnesty Policy Memo #A-15

1. References:

- a. AR 710-2, Supply Policy Below the National Level, 28 Mar 08.
- b. DA PAM 710-2-1, Using Unit Supply System (Manual Procedures), 31 Dec 97.

2. In accordance with Army Regulation (AR) 710-2, the Rock Island Arsenal Directorate of Logistics (DOL) has established an Ammunition Amnesty Program. The Ammunition Amnesty Program is necessary to ensure maximum recovery of military ammunition, explosives and residue items (no commercial ammunition).

3. This program is established to provide an opportunity for individuals to return ammunition which has been stolen, misplaced, or erroneously left in the possession of a unit after turn-in and reconciliation has been finalized. These returns can be made without fear of prosecution.

4. More specific information can be found in AR 710-2, Department of the Army Pamphlet (DA PAM) 710-2-1, and 710-2-2 contained in the Unit Supply Update. Ammunition falling into this category may be turned in at the Ammunition Supply Point, Bldg 280 with no questions asked, without documentation, without fear of disciplinary actions, and with no visual recording devices used to monitor potential turn-ins.

5. The Amnesty Program is not designed, nor will it be used, to circumvent normal turn-in procedures. Unit commanders are to make every effort to recover unused ammunition and turn it in to the Ammunition Supply Point as specified in DA PAM 710-2-1, chapter 11.

6. Ammunition turned in under the Ammunition Amnesty Program does not relieve Commanders of the responsibility to account for all ammunition issued as specified in AR 710-2 and DA PAM 710-2-1. All shortages will be cleared as specified in DA PAM 710-2-1, chapter 11.

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7. All shortages will be accounted for and cleared as specified under the provisions of AR 735-5, AR 190-11 or National Guard Regulation 190-11, as applicable.

8. Amnesty turn-ins will be accepted one of two ways with no questions asked and without documentation:

a. By Ammunition Storage personnel at the Ammunition Supply Point, Bldg 280, on a quarterly basis (schedule to be determined).

b. An Amnesty box is located and available anytime at the Ammunition Supply Point, Bldg 280. The Amnesty box is:

- 1) Available for .50 caliber ammunition and below.
- 2) Available anytime (24 hours a day/7 days a week).
- 3) Emptied at least once a week.

9. Expiration date. This policy will remain in effect until cancelled or superseded in writing.
